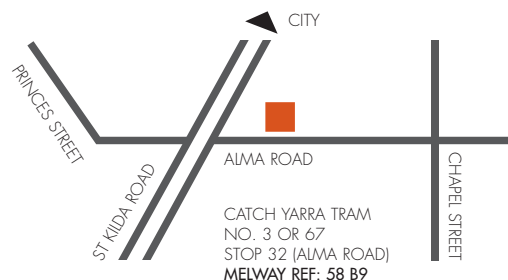
Morning walks meet at 10.15am for 10.30am sharp start.

WALK THE TALK THROUGH HISTORIC JEWISH MELBOURNE



Join Jewish Museum of Australia guides, Terry Ashton and Leon Haskin, on a Sunday walk through historic Jewish Melbourne. They're entertaining, educational and always enjoyable.



MELBOURNE CITY CENTRE

Visit a variety of city institutions and landmarks to discover their hidden Jewish histories including Flinders Street Station; Port Phillip Hotel; Cheapside House; Portland House; Cashmore Lake, the city quagmire; Bourke Street Synagogue; Royal Arcade; the Myer Emporium; the first mikvah; Kozminsky's; the Block Arcade.

Meet under the clocks at Flinders Street Station

ST KILDA

After Carlton, St Kilda became the home of many Jews in Melbourne. Find out why Jewish families loved this beachside town and infused the area with a European sensibility. You'll visit 'Linden'; St Kilda Town Hall; Christ's Church Parish Hall; Luna Park; Palais Theatre and Acland Street with its wonderful cake shops.

Meet at St Kilda Town Hall (under the portico)

LEON HASKIN'S FLINDERS LANE: SCHMATTE BUSINESS

Relive the halcyon days of last century when Flinders Lane was the epicentre of the Australian fashion industry. Walk with rag-trader, Leon Haskin, as he brings to life the buildings, businesses, characters and anecdotes of the 'Lane' and the schmatte* business. (*schmatte – Yiddish, meaning rag).

Meet at the corner of Spring Street & Flinders Lane

EAST MELBOURNE

Visit some of the most intriguing reminders of early Jewish history, including the Albert Street Synagogue; Victoria Artist's Society: the "Foreigners' Shule"; Melbournia Terrace; Burlington Terrace; 'Ensor'; Trades Hall; 'Benevenuta' and the City Baths.

Meet at the East Melbourne Synagogue, 488 Albert Street, East Melbourne

JEWISH CHINATOWN

Discover the hidden Jewish connections to sights in Chinatown such as Her Majesty's Theatre; Florentino's; the Eastern Market; the Chinese National Club; the Sun Kum Lee Building and Cohen Place.

Meet outside Her Majesty's Theatre—Exhibition Street

BALLARAT DAY TOUR

This year's tour to Ballarat will coincide with the Ballarat Heritage Festival weekend. Participants on this tour will be able to avail themselves of not only the hidden Jewish treasures of this grand Victorian city, but also the Ballarat Synagogue; a guided tour of Ballarat General Cemetery; the Eureka Memorial; the Australian POW Memorial and some surprises! There will also be the opportunity to visit the Ballarat Botanical Gardens. Morning and afternoon tea provided. BYO picnic lunch. Cost: \$75.00 per person.

Meet at 8.15 for a PROMPT 8.30a.m. departure. Return: JMA 5.30pm. Limited seating on bus.

MANSIONS OF EAST MELBOURNE

Stroll through graceful Victorian thoroughfares to revisit the grandeur of early Melbourne. See the former home of Sir John Monash, academic, engineer, war hero; the Freemasons Hospital; Bishops Court, the former home of Sir Benjamin Benjamin, politician and Mayor of Melbourne; Chandos; the site of Cliveden Mansions (now the Hilton Hotel); 'Little Pardon'; Queen Bess Row and more.

Meet at the corner Clarendon Street & Wellington Parade (Hilton Hotel side)

NORTH CARLTON

This area of North Carlton was home to many working class families as well as migrants including Jewish traders and families, many of whom established homes and businesses often as a result of fleeing persecution and anti-semitism in Europe. Visit the homes of former Jewish tradespeople; see where Rabbi Joseph Gurewicz lived; the Peretz Yiddish School; Pose's Pickles; Tel Aviv Diary; Kadimah and more.

Meet on the corner of Lee and Rathdowne Streets, North Carlton
